## Cause:

Persistent engine misfire logging DTC P1315 Persistent Misfire - No sub type information also logged within the Powertrain Control Module (PCM). This may cause lower exhaust gas temperatures which then triggers P0142-00 and is resulting in false replacements of Oxygen sensor although the sensor is functioning correctly, resulting in repeat claims.
