Most notable improvements contained in this release may include:

Radio:

- SXM Presets (favorites) deleted after adding a new one.
- SXM shows "Loading Audio" after ignition on and then shows "Channel Not Available".
- SXM shows Channel Not available after Google
 Assistant Command
- Trailering app stuck in loading screen after ignition cycle
- No channel number/metadata shown and control buttons shown as inactive on SXM now playing screen
